Goodwin Selected for Leadership Cincinnati Class 38

In the past, this has included creating the Charitable Pharmacy (which filled \$4.9 million of prescriptions for free in 2013); the Power Pack program (which provides critical food for nearly 4,000 students in 90 schools every week); Cincy Bikes and the breakthrough Preschool Promise program that has placed access to quality preschool on the region's agenda.

2013 marked a banner year for ATC. Both regional offices exceeded previously held revenue highs. Advanced implementations, new customers, bandwidth upgrades, and cloud migrations led to record annual revenue. But, more importantly, what made the year monumental was ATC's continued community support and outreach.
